

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Step 1. Learning the Parts of Your New Paint Ball Gun




Step 2. Operating the Safety

A. To put the paint ball gun "On Safe", locate the safety in back of the trigger. Push the safety from the left side all the way in (Fig. 1). The safety is not on unless it is pushed all the way in and the red line around the safety is not showing. The paint ball gun will not fire when "On Safe".

B. Even when the safety is on you should continue to handle the paint ball gun safely. Don't point the paint ball gun at anything you don't intend to shoot.

C. To take the paint ball gun "Off Safe", push the safety from the right side all the way in.

When you can see the red line around the safety, the paint ball gun is "Off Safe" and will fire




⚠ WARNING: KEEP THE PAINT BALL GUN "ON SAFE" UNTIL YOU ARE ACTUALLY READY TO SHOOT. THEN PUSH IT TO "OFF SAFE".

Step 3. Removing and Installing CO₂ Cylinder ⚠ CAUTION: KEEP HANDS AWAY FROM ESCAPING CO₂ GAS. IT CAN CAUSE FROSTBITE IF ALLOWED TO COME IN CONTACT WITH SKIN.

A. Removing CO₂ Cylinder.

- Unload the paint ball gun. (Step 4B).
- Put paint ball gun "On Safe". (See Step 2).
- · Slide the forearm back until the rear engages.
- Hold the paint ball gun in one hand. With the other hand, slowly turn the filler cap counterclockwise, completely allowing the release of remaining CO₂ through the action.
- Pull the filler assembly from the action tube and remove the empty CO₂ cylinder by pointing the muzzle of the paint ball gun down.



B. Installing New CO₂ Cylinder

- Insert the new CO₂ cylinder into the paint ball gun with the small neck of the cylinder into the action tube first. (Fig. 2).
- Replace the filler cap assembly in the action tube. Be sure to screw the filler cap completely into place.
- With paint ball gun unloaded and pointed in a SAFE DIRECTION, take "Off Safe", slide forearm back until sear engages with a click. Push forearm forward to close bolt and pull the trigger. This will pierce the CO₂ cylinder and paint ball gun will be fully charged. If not, repeat cocking and firing the gun until the paint ball gun expels CO₂.
- Return safety to the "On Safe" position.

⚠ CAUTION: BE SURE THE PAINTBALL GUN IS UNLOADED WHEN RELEASING THE CO₂ CHARGE. IF A PAINTBALL IS LEFT IN THE BARREL AND A NEW CYLINDER IS INSERTED AND PIERCED BY COCKING AND PULLING THE TRIGGER, THE PAINTBALL WILL BE EXPELLED. ALWAYS POINT THE PAINTBALL GUN IN A SAFE DIRECTION WHEN CHARGING.

⚠ CAUTION: WE RECOMMEND THE USE OF SHERIDAN 12 GRAM CO₂ CYLINDERS. THEY ARE MADE TO FIT THE PGP. OTHER BRANDS OF CO₂ CYLINDERS MAY NOT FIT PROPERLY AND IF YOU FORCE THEM INTO PLACE IT MAY RESULT IN INJURY TO YOU OR DAMAGE TO YOUR PAINT BALL GUN. NEVER TRY TO FORCE ANY CO₂ CYLINDER INTO OR OUT OF PLACE.

⚠ WARNING: CO₂ CYLINDERS MAY EXPLODE AT TEMPERATURES ABOVE 120°F. DO NOT MUTILATE OR INCINERATE THEM. DO NOT EXPOSE THEM TO HEAT OR STORE THEM AT TEMPERATURES ABOVE 120°F.

Step 4. Loading and Unloading Paint Ball Gun

A. Loading the Paint Ball Gun

- Put the paint ball gun "On Safe". (See Step 2).
- Remove rear magazine plug and fill magazine with .68 caliber paint balls. (Fig. 3).
- Replace the rear magazine plug in magazine.



- While holding the gun with the muzzle in the upward position, slide forearm back until sear engages with a click and action stays open. (Fig. 4).
- Push forearm forward and the paint ball will be in the firing position.







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- B. Unloading the Paint Ball Gun
 - Put the paint ball gun "On Safe". (See Step 2).
 - Remove rear magazine plug.
 - Hold the gun with the muzzle in the upward position and allow the remaining paint balls in the magazine to empty out of the magazine . (Fig. 5).





• To make sure the barrel is clear, hold the gun upside down with the muzzle in the upward position, slide the forearm back until sear engages with a click and action stays open, insert a ramrod or similar tool into the muzzle end of the barrel and if there is a paint ball chambered in the gun, gently push the paint ball back so that it can fall into and out of the magazine. (Fig. 6).

Don't try to reuse that paint ball again.

⚠ CAUTION: USE .68 CALIBER PAINT BALLS ONLY AS AMMUNITION. DO NOT USE ANY OTHER TYPE OF AMMUNITION.

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Step 5. Aiming and Firing Safely

- Always aim your paint ball gun in a SAFE DIRECTION. When you are sure of your target and the area around the target is clear, take the paint ball gun "Off Safe" and squeeze the trigger to fire.
- The paint ball may bounce off or ricochet if shot at hard surfaces. It is best to wear shooting glasses to protect your eyes.
- Always check to see that the paint ball gun is "On Safe" and unloaded when getting it from another person or from storage. Don't put the paint ball gun away loaded.

Step 6. Maintaining Your Paint Ball Gun

- The barrel, magazine and tube are made of a rust resistant, hard, nonferrous alloy and require no special treatment.
- Tampering with the gun or attempts to change the gun in any way make it unsafe to
 use. If you drop your gun, check it to see that it works properly before you use it
 again. If anything seems changed, like a shorter or weaker trigger pull, this may
 mean worn out or broken parts. Don't use it again until you've had it checked by our
 factory service department.

Step 7. Reviewing Safety

- Don't point at anything you don't intend to shoot. Always aim in a SAFE DIRECTION.
- · Always wear head, throat, and eye protection.
- Always keep the paint ball gun "On Safe" until you are ready to shoot.
- Do not attempt to disassemble or tamper with your paint ball gun. Please return your paint ball gun to the factory for repair.
- · Always handle your paint ball gun as though it were loaded.
- Always check to see if the paint ball gun is "On Safe" and unloaded when getting it from another person or from storage.
- Don't put paint ball gun away loaded or charged with CO2.
- Use .68 caliber paint balls only as ammunition.
